## School Transportation Plan Ahead for Fall

The 2015-2016 school year is right around the corner. It's not too early to start planning for your child's transportation needs. The City of Le Sueur Transit department provides bus services to all children within Le Sueur City limits. Buses are "mobility equipped" and wheel chairs are easily accommodated.

## Certification of Delinquent Utility Accounts

The City Council has approved a process to certify *severely delinquent residential utility accounts* to the County Auditor for collection with the following year's property taxes. A severely delinquent account is one in which the property owner has received two consecutive months of service without full payment to the City for the service provided.

In August of each year the City Council will set a public hearing date in September at which they will hear any disputes. City staff will send a letter to each property owner with a severely delinquent utility account notifying them of the balance owed and the public hearing date.

Following the public hearing, residents with delinquent accounts will have until September 30<sup>th</sup> to pay the outstanding balance in full. If the balance is not paid in full by the 30<sup>th</sup>, it will be certified to the County Auditor (including any accrued late fees and interest) for collection with the following year's property taxes.

## Ordinance Update

### Discharge of Firearms and Use of Air Rifles, Bows and Arrows

An ordinance amending City code with regard to the discharge of firearms, use of air rifles, bows and arrows was approved by the City Council on July 27th. Language regarding shotguns has been clarified and the proposed regulations now allow the use of bow and arrow in designated locations of the City. These property locations are generally along the river for residents who wish to allow bow hunting on their properties. ## Interested in Giving Back to Your Community? Join the Le Sueur Ambulance!



The Le Sueur Ambulance Department is calling for volunteers. Community members are encouraged to step forward and help their community by joining the Ambulance service.

There are numerous benefits to becoming an EMT and joining the ambulance service including: camaraderie, the satisfaction of helping someone in need, flexible hours, free continuing education, it looks great on your resume and shows leadership in our community. This is a volunteer service, but members are reimbursed for calls. Initial training classes are typically held in Mankato and involve two evenings/week and two Saturdays. Requirements include monthly training meetings, 40 hours/month of on-call time and participation in public events. Members must also have a 5-minute response time to the Ambulance garage. We are specifically looking for weekday and weekend volunteers.

The ambulance ride along program is for people who may be interested in becoming an EMT. Observers in the ride along program are required to sign a form outlining the guidelines and requirements of the program and are not involved in patient care. Each observer is given a pager and is scheduled like the active ambulance members.

## Volleyball & Full-Contact Football through the Le Sueur Community Center

**Volleyball:** for Girls entering 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Grade in the fall.
