

Severe Weather Awareness Week Don't Forget the Threat

**Families, Schools, & Businesses Should
Participate in Tornado Drills April 18th, 2013**

Severe Weather Awareness Week takes place April 15-19 this year, with a statewide tornado drill on Thursday, April 18, 2013 at 1:45 p.m. The National Weather Service will issue a simulated tornado warning, and outdoor warning sirens will be activated. At 6:55 p.m., a second drill will take place in Le Sueur County for families to practice their weather safety plans.

Everyone should take this opportunity to practice their own safety plans during Severe Weather Awareness Week. There is no pattern to where or when severe weather will occur. A tornado can happen without warning day or night and being prepared can save lives.

According to the National Weather Service data, tornados have occurred in every Minnesota County at some point during the past 58 years. Le Sueur County has experienced 19 tornados since 1950. The Minnesota Department of Public Safety Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, along with the National Weather Service, and American Red Cross, sponsor Severe Weather Awareness Week annually to promote weather knowledge and planning. 

WHO CAN BRING THEIR MATERIALS TO THE SITE?

Residents who live in the City limits of Le Sueur. All residents should be prepared to show their driver's license or an alternate form of identification if needed. No waste from non-residential customers, contractors, businesses or those residing outside of the City limits will be accepted.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS AND PREPARATION GUIDELINES:

- General non-hazardous household waste "junk"
- Furniture items
 - Couches/chairs/tables/mattresses/box springs/etc.
- Small amounts of re-modeling materials
 - Siding/dried-out paint cans/drywall/carpet, etc.
- All items should be boxed, bagged or contained in some manner
- Absolutely NO loads of loose shingles or tires will be accepted!

WE CANNOT ACCEPT:

- Asbestos
- Batteries (auto/flashlight/etc.)
- Chemical products (herbicides/pesticides)
- Fluorescent tubes & light bulbs
- Hazardous, industrial, infectious waste
- Liquid waste, paints, thinners, removers
- Oils, oil rags (any type of oil drilling waste)
- Radioactive materials
- Tires
- Yard waste (grass clippings/trees/shrubs)

All residents should be prepared to pay City of Le Sueur Staff for the following items:
