Severe Weather Awareness Week Don't Forget the Threat

Families, Schools and Businesses Should Participate in Tornado Drills on April 12th

Are you ready for severe weather? Each year the Homeland Security and Emergency Management department, along with federal, state, and local agencies sponsor **Severe Weather Awareness week in Minnesota**. Activities are designed to refresh, remind, and educate everyone about the seasonal threats from severe weather and how to avoid them. There is no pattern to where or when severe weather will occur. A tornado can happen without warning day or night and being prepared can save lives.

Severe Weather Awareness Week takes place April 9th – 13th, with a statewide tornado drill on **Thursday, April 12th** at 1:45pm. The National Weather Service will issue a simulated tornado warning and outdoor warning sirens will be activated. At 6:55pm, a second drill will take place in Le Sueur County for families to practice their weather safety plans. ACCEPTABLE ITEMS AND PREPARATION GUIDELINES

- Appliances*
- Electronics*
- General non-hazardous waste ("junk")
- Furniture (couches/chairs/tables/mattresses)
- Siding/dried-out paint cans/drywall/carpet/etc.
- All items must be boxed, bagged or contained and/or easily transferable into garbage receptacles
