



City Council Priorities 2016-2017

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- Create Task Force or sub-committee of the City Council to study **Economic Development** in Le Sueur including future staffing options for both the EDA and Economic Development in general
 - Provide the City Council with a report that demonstrates how the City currently **communicates and markets** the City
 - Resolve **franchise fee** issue/policy
 - Clarify City's relationship with MN Valley Health Center (**MVHC**)
 - Complete **Capital Improvement Plan** update for effective infrastructure reinvestment
 - Provide **Sidewalk Plan Update** to the City Council
 - City Council to provide staff with direction on **Property Maintenance** enforcement
 - Provide City Council with "**Long-term Goal Check-in**" at six-months
 - Begin dialogue with the **School District** on inter-dependencies.
 - Continue to discuss ordinances that will address **odor nuisances**
 - Complete review of **City Charter**
 - Implement **Pavement Management** Plan
 - Complete **Comprehensive Plan Update** process



City Council Goals

Long Term Goals (Goal Areas)

2020

- **Housing:** In order to ensure safe, livable and attractive housing which in turn increases long-term neighborhood stability, the City's economic viability and tax base, the City will encourage compliance with property maintenance codes and the rental licensing program and it will regulate the state building code. By 2020 the City, in partnership with the EDA, will have implemented the 2015 Housing Plan.
- **Economic Development:** In order to retain, expand and attract businesses that create high-quality jobs, the City, in partnership with the EDA, will by 2020 have developed and begun to implement strategic initiatives to enhance the City's business climate.
- **Planning:** Follow-thru on 2016 Comprehensive Plan Update by developing and implementing an action plan based on the recommended Comp Plan strategies.
- **Infrastructure:** Update the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) in order to preserve the City's infrastructure while ensuring efficient use of tax dollars. The CIP will (1) identify capital projects and equipment purchases, and (2) provide a planning schedule with options for financing.
- **Financial Management:** Develop a long-term financial plan that incorporates best practices for accountability, operations, reporting, and financial sustainability of the City.
