Community Center membership have been on the rise since we opened back up in 2020 after the covid shut down.

- Kisi door access system – This system is being installed currently. This new system will allow members to access the facility with their smartphones or with the current cards that we use. This will also make it much easier to give access when the office is closed by sending non-members a barcode if they would like a daily pass.

- Golf Simulator
 - planned to be installed by the end of September
 - We are partnering with Molly King from Inspired Athletx for a golf fitness class. Molly is originally from Le Sueur and reached out about partnering with us for golf fitness. She is a physical therapist with Inspired Athletx. She is willing to come back to run a golf fitness class geared toward sport specific workouts. Inspired Athletx also runs a web-based platform that we will advertise within the community center. This partnership has the potential to bring in more members to not only use the golf simulator but the fitness center as well.
 - Grand open day events are being planned

- Regular Ice Arena Season – we are opening a week early this season to be able to offer New Prague ice times. New Prague is doing construction on their arena and will not be ready for use when the season starts. This arrangement will not conflict with our association times.

➤ **ACCEPTABLE ITEMS AND PREPARATION GUIDELINES**

General Non-Hazardous Household Waste “junk”

Furniture items (Couches, Chairs, Tables, Mattresses, Box Springs, etc.)

Small amounts of Re-modeling materials (Siding, Dried out paint cans, Drywall, Carpet, etc.)

All items should be boxed, bagged or contained in some manner or they will not be accepted.

Absolutely NO pickup loads of loose shingles or tires will be accepted!
